

Dear Parents and Guardians,

Over the past few months, our car-pool loop has increased with the amount of riders for many reasons. Unfortunately, we have great concern that our car-loop safety is diminishing. We really need your help to implement a safe delivery of students to school each day. Here is how you can help:

Please put your children on the bus. The only students that are not assigned buses are our preschool students. Other children that occasionally should be car-riders are students with larger musical instruments on various occasions. If these two groups of students were the only ones that used the car-loop, that would be ideal.

If you decide to drive your child to school one day for a particular reason, PLEASE USE THE LOOP. Parking in a spot will seem to make things a little faster for you but in the end, this slows the car-loop down and causes an increase in unsafe maneuvering of traffic and students.

Lastly, if you decide to drive your child on a specific day, please make sure your child is ready to quickly exit the vehicle on the passenger side only. This is a "kiss and ride" car-loop. Kiss them before you pull up to the sidewalk and they can quickly exit the car! This will save time.

Ultimately, we want to get parents to work on time and children into the school on-time, and in the safest manner possible.

# Learning Together Peer Program

The Dayton Oaks Regional Early Childhood Center (RECC) toddler and preschool programs will be accepting applications for classes for the 2017/2018 school year. These classes include children with and without disabilities. The program's focus is to help all children develop communication, literacy, math, problem solving, motor, and social skills. Parents of children who will be 3 by September 1 or 4 years of age may contact the school office for an application package.

All applications must be returned by Friday March 31, 2017. A limited number of openings are available for children without disabilities. Children are selected based upon screening information given on the application form and the "Ages and Stages Questionnaire," as well as observations of the child's participation in a playgroup. If necessary, a lottery process is conducted.
